The Plank in our own eye

This month at Geneva we have been looking at Matthew Chapter 7 where Jesus talks about judging others. In Verse 3 Jesus says: "Why do you look at the speck of sawdust in your brother's eye and pay no attention to the plank in your own eye? How can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when all the time there is a plank in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the plank out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye." What Jesus is saying is that we should not judge one another because; we cannot see clearly, To illustrate this point Jesus uses hyperbolic language, or hyperbole, in other words he exaggerates to make a point. Which is something we all do at times, How big was the fish? He contrasts a big plank with a speck of dust, He says you criticise the people around you when you see a speck of dust in their eye, but you have a plank in your own. In other words what Jesus is saying is this, that we judge people around us for small faults, whilst we have big faults of our own. Jesus is encouraging us to look at our own lives first before we look for small faults in the lives of others. This is what he means by taking the plank out of your own eye, have a good look at yourself, see what you are doing that is wrong, and work to straighten that out. And then He goes on to say; maybe then, when you have taken the plank out of your own eye, realising that you have faults of your own, you will be in a position to begin to help someone else, without judging them. These are challenging words for all of us, may God give us the grace and strength of character to judge ourselves first.
