UPDATE TO THE SCHOOL COMMUNITY

Yesterday we received a memo from the Education Minister indicating that Tasmanian states schools will be starting their Easter holiday break earlier, making their last day Friday, April 2nd. We have been advised that at this stage having schools open is not a health risk, therefore, the Geneva Board and I have made the decision to keep the school open and finish the term two days earlier, making our last day Tuesday, April 7th. Teachers will remain at school until Thursday to start their planning for Term 2.

If families have decided or will decide to self-isolate and not return to school this term, I am fully supportive of that and along with my staff will seek to facilitate your child's continued learning while at home for these next few weeks. Self-isolation means that households limit their movements and stay home, with one family member only going out for supplies and undertaking necessary business. So please don't take you children to shopping centres or supermarkets, or let them ride their bike to the park, they must practise social distancing in the wider community.

At this stage we cannot forecast what Term 2 will look like. If we will be fully operational, or not, is difficult to say, however I will keep you informed via email and our face book page, as official information comes to me. Please understand I cannot make decisions based on innuendo or supposition and will act only on direct instruction from the authorities. At this stage Geneva will remain open and operating.

Thank you to those families who have shown and offered their support and sent words of encouragement during this difficult season. It is not something any of us envisaged and certainly don't wish to repeat. But like real seasons, there is something good that seems to always come out of them. We have observed students rise up and take the lead, we have seen precious gifts of love and random acts of kindness and these are the moments where teachers realise their efforts are not in vain. For the growth of a child is not merely their intellectual knowledge, but how they behave, react, respond and treat others. So thankyou again for the privilege of sharing the journey with you in training your children for now and eternity!




