PEACE

A message by the primary chaplain - Mr Jack Dance

With everything happening around the world. What do we do when we are lacking peace?

In John 16, we find Jesus sharing his last message with his disciples (followers) before being arrested by the Romans with the help of his follower turned traitor, Judas. In this moment, you would think Jesus would be lacking peace, as he knows his death is only a day away. It would make more sense that his disciples are to provide some comfort to him. Yet, Jesus has peace, and he had enough of it to give to others.

"...in me you may have peace."

Notice, Jesus didn't promise peace, but offered it. It can be easy to be a follower of Jesus but not have peace. We gain the peace Jesus is offering by finding it in him. We often think this will only be available the moment when we don't have trials and tribulations anymore. But if you read further on, Jesus says that in this world we are going to have trials and trouble. The peace he is offering isn't the elimination of trouble, it's peace we can have even in the middle of the trouble.

We can be assured of this peace because its foundation is built upon this promise. "But take heart! I have overcome the world".

Remember Jesus is saying this before his death, which to most would look more like defeat than victory. We know it to be true that in his resurrection, Jesus has won! Notice Jesus said this. to comfort and strengthen his disciples. Jesus is speaking of his victory, not directly their (his disciples) victory. This isn't a "cheer up" or "try harder" motivational speech. But instead he knew that His victory would be theirs (and ours). So, we live in a time of now but not yet. Jesus has won the victory but yet the outworking of his victory is still coming till the day he comes back and it is fully established.

So, would his peace be yours, as it is mine? Even with so much going on around the world and maybe so much happening in your own world. Would we take heart? Jesus has overcome and the fullness of his victory is on its way.
