#### WHERE DID WE COME FROM?

A message by the Secondary Chaplain - Mr Darren Eyle:

Question: where did we come from? And when I ask that question I am not asking who your mother was, but rather where did all mothers come from? Or, where did all life come from?

This is a question we should all ask ourselves, because our answer to this question will determine how we see the world, and then how we act in it.

You would have to admit that there could not be many possible answers to this question.

This term our students are learning Psalm 100. In it the Psalmist give us a possible answer, for him: "It is He (God) who made us, and we are His; we are His people, the sheep of His pasture".

This Psalm is based on the idea that God exists, that He created us, and that He cares for us. He then uses an analogy of a shepherd from the ancient world, who knew their sheep by name and treated them like their children.

The Psalmist says, God exists, He made us, He cares for us like a shepherd, and that all of these facts are a good thing, and should be celebrated. That all the earth should worship this God with gladness, and come before Him with songs, in other words, we should sing to Him!

Psalm 100:5 "the Lord is good, and His love endures forever; His faithfulness continues through all generations."

I think we would all like this to be true, wouldn't we? Who would not want a God who loved and cared for them? But how would we know that this is true? Well, we can know, because of Jesus.

The same God that the Psalmist was worshiping, is the God who sent Jesus, to be one of us; to live amongst us, to suffer with us and for us, to show us how much He loved and cared for us. Put simply, we can know that this is true, we can understand why we should praise and worship this God, as we get to know Jesus.
