DANGER, PLEASE READ THIS!!!

As adults, would we put a loaded gun in our child's hand, or what about a syringe filled with methadone? I hear you say 'no, of course not'. But how many of our children have a mobile phone, iPad, XBOX, Play Station or TV, either in their hand or in their bedroom? Do you want to direct and influence your children for good and be able to talk them through difficult episodes in their lives or are you leaving this to Google or Siri, or a complete stranger? We are seeing a massive rise in youth mental health problems; stress, anxiety and depression and this is not just young adults, it is children as young as 5. This is serious! Our young people are being influenced by the trends of the world. They believe there is a certain way they need to act, look and speak. They think they have to make life decisions right now, to fit in. They write things to others, that they would never say face to face. We know that the developing child also has a developing brain. This means, their brains are not fully grown. We don't let them drive a car, vote or drink, because the law says they are not adults yet, they are not capable of making mature and wise decisions. Then why would we let them make life changing decisions about their minds and bodies at this young age.

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The Bible tells us that our children are our heritage and a blessing. If we don't intervene, we are not showing love and care for our kids and we certainly are not acting as responsible adults. I sat with them all last night and listened to their take on this 'social experiment' at Interlaken. They have bonded as a big family. They have lived, worked, eaten, cried, laughed, argued and loved together. They are becoming the person who God intended them to be.

Mum and Dad, make changes in your home today, to direct your family in the right way. Start having meals together around the table, have conversations with your children about what's happening in their lives, turn off devices, remove them from bedrooms, get out board games and cards, kick the footy, ride the bike, shoot hoops, cook together and for the sake of your child's future, don't make them compete for your attention, while holding a mobile phone in your hand. We have our children for such a short time, let's make that time count for good!
