RESPOND OR REACT?

A message from Mrs Lincolne

My dad taught me to drive. I was 15 at the time and he took me out at least three times each week in my 1956 Hillman. I thought it was so cool. But, as I was still a teenager my dad knew that my experience was limited. The road and weather conditions could change and he wanted me to be prepared for such changes when I was driving. So, one day he took me onto a gravel road. I was travelling slowly at first and then my confidence grew and I sped up. He knew this and at one stage grabbed the steering wheel and pulled it into the piled up gravel on the side of the road. The wheels slipped and spun out. I reacted and jammed on the brakes. This action caused the car to go sideways back and forth across the road. Dad calmly said, take your foot off the brake. It went against all my thoughts, but I took my foot off. The car righted itself and slowed down... and stalled. He explained that braking made the wheels lock up and I actually had no control over the car at that stage. He said if I responded by decelerating and not braking, I could guide the car gently back onto the road. He demonstrated this to me a few times afterward and I then felt more confident under such conditions. This reminded me of life situations. When things are going out of control, our first instinct is to react before thinking, often resulting in the situation getting worse. If we are wise enough to stop and think we will find we will respond in a more calm and gracious way. Picture a fire on the ground that is quickly growing bigger and looks like getting out of control. Would you pour petrol (react) or water (respond) on it? One would certainly make the situation worse, the other would calm it down. I know from personal experience, that taking time to respond has saved me further trouble and heartache. The Bible teaches me. that a soft answer turns away anger! So ask yourself, do I react or respond to life's situations?
