STICKS AND STONES!!

None of us like criticism! But if we look at it with a different attitude it can work to our advantage. Let me explain. Nehemiah had critics as he led a team to rebuild the wall of Jerusalem. There were people constantly mocking Nehemiah and those working alongside him, pretty much every day. They taunted things like, “even a fox climbing up on that wall could break it down” (Nehemiah 4:3).

Nehemiah didn't yell back, he didn't feel dejected and dwell on himself, he did what he knew best would work. He turned to God for help. He asked God to hear the way His people were being treated and to defend them and then they continued working steadily on the wall, “With all their heart.”

We can learn from Nehemiah not to be distracted by others criticism. There is an old saying, “sticks and stones will break my bones, but names will never hurt me.” The truth is, criticism does hurt, but when we're criticised or mocked, instead of responding to our critics out of hurt or anger, we can prayerfully ask God to defend us from discouragement so we can continue with a whole heart!

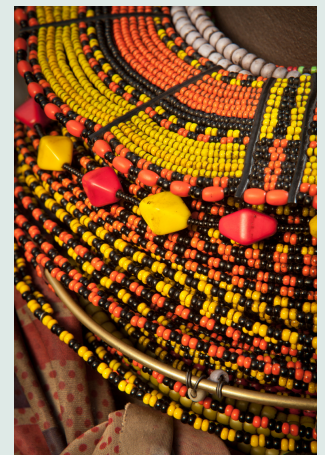
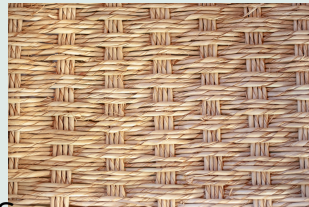
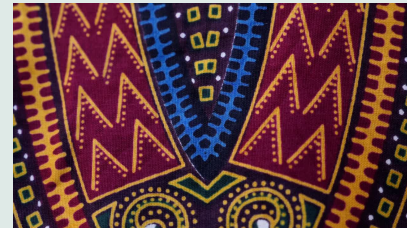
THE EVERYBODY PROGRAMME

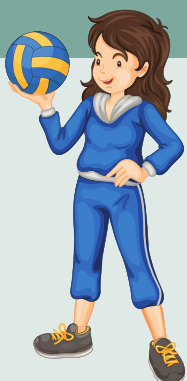
