### **GENEVA ORIENTATION DAY - 2024**

ORIENTATION - 'MOVE UP'

Towards the end month, on Wednesday, November 29, the whole school holds an Orientation 'Move up' time (usually 2 periods), where students go to their next year's classroom and participate in conversations and activities relating to what they can expect the following year. Each class/subject teacher prepare activities and information to help prepare students for their 'move up' to the next class. The implementation of transition and induction activities ensures that students are supported in their transfer to the next class.

KINDER TASTER DAY:

Also held on the same day as Orientation Day, Wednesday, November 29 from 10:45am-12:45pm, Kinder Taster Day is for parents and eligible new 2024 Kindergarten students, to meet one another, the teacher and get to know classroom procedures. If you are interested in Kindergarten for your child, in 2024 and have not yet had the initial interview with the Principal and a secondary interview with the Kindergarten teacher, please contact the school office to make these appointments.

### **SWIMMING CARNIVAL**

Our Swimming Carnival is NEXT THURSDAY, November 30th at the Devonport Aquatic Centre (SPLASH). We will be competing against Australian Christian College – Burnie, North West Christian School and also against home schooling families. The programme will commence at 10.30am for both juniors and seniors (big and small pools). We will commence with the 100m and 50m events first, finishing with the Secondary Raft Race before commencing with the 20m events.

### **TRANSPORT**

Students will travel to school as normal and leave for the carnival shortly after 9.45am. We aim to finish at 2:30pm and return to school for normal bus runs home. Please let the class teacher know in your child's diary if you are taking your child to and/or from the carnival. The Kinder students are not required to attend the swimming carnival and will remain at school.
