A message from our Senior School Chaplain

There is a story in the Bible where Daniel (Chapter 5), and his good friends, Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, were living in exile as slaves in Babylon around 550 BC. The story goes like this. One evening King Belshazzar was holding a party and a hand appeared on the wall and wrote a message. Belshazzar quivered in fear at the sight of the hand but couldn't read the writing. Daniel was called for and translated the message for the king. The message was directed to Belshazzar. It said:

"You have been weighed in the balance and found wanting."

This reminds me of what we have recently been looking at in Psalm 19 where David said, "who can discern his own errors and keep back your servant from willful sins"? We also read in Proverbs 21:2, "a person may think their own ways are right, but the Lord weighs the heart."

The point is that in the Bible it is God who weighs our heart! It is not a matter of how much good we have done compared to how bad we are, it's how God sees our hearts.

The Bible clearly states that 'all have sinned' meaning we all do wrong things, all the time. We know this is true and so if weighing our good against our bad were the test, we certainly would all fail.

We are coming up to Christmas, a time that we celebrate the birth of Jesus. We need to ask ourselves, 'why did Jesus need to be born?

According to the Bible, Jesus came, born as man, died and was raised from the dead, to reconcile the whole creation and that includes each one of us! This is why it is called the 'Gospel', which in Greek literally means 'good news'.

The good news about Jesus is that the outcome of our lives is not determined by the weighing of our hearts. It is determined by our relationship with God. Jesus says He has taken the punishment for all the wrong things that we have done. He says, 'f you will come to me, submit to me, follow me, I will forgive you all the wrongs of your past. I will empower you to live well in the future and invite you to take part in the life that is to come after this one. Does that sound like good news to you?
