A message from our Principal

HOPE is one of our school's core values. Today in whole school assembly I asked our students what they thought hope meant. The combined answers were along the lines of this: Hope is the positive expectation or desire that something good will happen. Many of us desire things we never expect and most of us expect things we never desire. I believe HOPE is a blend of both and could be described as the happy combination of what we desire, plus an expectation that it will happen. The Lord has given His people "one HOPE" (Eph. 4:4) which is described as the "anchor of the soul" (Heb. 6:19). The Bible tells us this "they that hope in the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint". No matter what, this verse reveals to us a positive outcome. I described the word HOPE as this: His Overwhelming Presence Everyday. 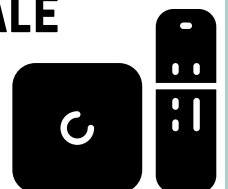

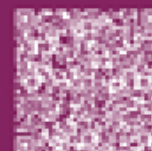
Tommy Coward - This is my first time at Interlaken and it is AWESOME! I am loving hanging out with my new friends.
