A message from the Principal

We often say "I remember when . . ." and usually it's something nice or fun that we're thinking of. It's rare we choose to remember wrong things we've done or said or unhappy events that have happened.

On November 11th, 1918 at 11.00am, the guns on the Western Front fell silent after more than four years of continuous fighting. The allied armies, including Australia had driven the German invaders back, having inflicted heavy defeats upon them over the preceding four months. The allied forces demanded an unconditional surrender, which the Germans had no choice but to accept. Peace was restored!

So now, every year, at 11 o'clock on the 11th day of the 11th month, Australia and other allied nations, stop to remember those men and women who served and died during battle.

Today is Remembrance Day. We held a short service here at Geneva on the terraced area. The students wore red poppies, a wreath was laid by Liam Hall & Anabelle Davey (Year 2) and Emma Baldock (Year 6) gave the address. Our Year 9 students & staff represented Geneva at the public service in Latrobe. They took part in the service by leading the National Anthem and laying a wreath, well done Year 9's.

SCHOOL BANKING UPDATE FROM COMMONWEALTH BANK

For 90 years, our School Banking program has helped children learn about money, reinforced the importance of regular savings and provided structure for parents to support their children to save. Though the program continues to have strong support from schools, parents and teachers, recent decisions by some state and territory governments because of a review by the corporate regulator mean we are unable to continue providing programs in schools, and we have had to make a difficult decision to close our School Banking program for all government and non-government schools across the country.

Our School Banking program was established in 1931 at a time when having a bank account was not commonplace, and since then we have helped more than 15 million Australians take their first financial steps. This would not have been possible without the wonderful support we have received from schools like Geneva, including all the parents and volunteers, and for this we are deeply grateful. Thank you.

Even though this is a sad time, School Banking has taught so many young Australians, past and present, the value of money and we believe this should be celebrated. We have created a place for you to share your stories, fondest memories and lessons learnt through the program. INFORMATION

FEE SCHEDULE 2022

Prior to enrolment commencing, the first 4 weeks of total fees is required as a deposit. Keeping your fees up to date, indicates continued enrolment for your child. Fees for the current year must be paid in full for enrolment to continue into the next calendar year.

These fees do not include excursions or camps. You will be notified of these costs as they arise. There may also be fees associated with specialist subjects. You will be notified if this applies to your child.

In the past we have always helped support parents who required financial assistance. If you wish to discuss this, please do not hesitate to contact the school office and you will be issued with the associated paperwork for financial assistance approval.

Fee invoices will be issued at the beginning of the year, for the whole year and each term must be fully paid by the end of that term. Fees are payable either in full at the commencement of the year (a 5% discount applies), at the beginning of each term or fortnightly, by either cash, credit card, cheque, Centrepay or direct debit. Fee monies paid will not be refunded, should the child's enrolment cease during the school year.
